Concentration: 51 hours: see faculty advisor

Students must choose one of the following areas of concentration: ceramics, communication design, digital art, drawing, jewelry design and metalsmithing, painting, photography, printmaking, or sculpture. (The art education concentration is listed separately.)

A minimum 33 upper-division Art hours are required, 40 upper-division total for the degree as well as a 3 hour Senior Experience if not taken in the Major; see approved selections and prerequisites.
