Language Requirement

Linguistics majors must take 6 hrs of a single foreign language 2000-level (the courses must contain grammar) or above. Students who have not taken enough high school language to enter at the 2000-level will be required to take the prerequisite, 1000-level courses. Linguistics majors who are MDL minors must take either: 6 hrs of a different language than their minor 2000-level or above, or 6 hrs from the courses below in either LING and/or the interdiscipl. electives category.
