For admission into the BFA program in Applied Theatre Technology and Design, students must complete an intake interview during the spring or summer prior to the academic year enrolling in that program. Students should contact the technical theatre coordinator, Jacob Welch, at 303-352-4427 or jwelch25@msudenver.edu to schedule the interview and for additional information. (It is possible for students to declare a major in the Bachelor of Arts program while working toward acceptance to the BFA program.)

Students majoring in Applied Theatre Technology and Design must perform technical work on all four Metro State Theatre productions per academic year. Students should cycle through assorted production areas. All majors are free to audition for and work on additional productions. Students will follow established departmental application procedures for technical positions.
