- Prefer the 7 colleges model for the following reasons:
 - Currently, a majority of first-time students do not understand which college/department they belong to. They specifically do not understand what CPS or CLAS really means. With this change, students may be able to better understand what programs are offered at MSU Denver.
 - Easier to navigate; the path from start to finish will not be so clustered.
 - o Location of departments/colleges will be more defined.
 - Suggestion: Strengthen communication between departments and colleges.
 - The new model will be beneficial for potential employer recruiters as it will be clearer as to which department they need to work closely with.
 - Concern: Will this new change be less accessible to certain student populations? This new model may not work for all students; it depends on the student's personality and how they will perceive this (e.g. transfer students).
 - Suggestion: Can a BETA test be developed so that degrees are arranged in the system both ways so that students can determine which model works best for them?

- o Student did not know that she was a part of CPS, first appointment with advisor took forever.
- o Transfer student met with head advisor for CRJ and it was pretty smooth process.
- What role should a college play in your MSU Denver experience? No response.
- What do you identify more as: athlete or something else?
 - o Baseball is a hobby at this point, so I am focusing on my identity via my career track.
 - Student would identify more as an athlete—easier to have conversations wearing athletic gear vs. college of business shirt.
- If MSU Denver was given 1 million dollars, what would you purchase?
 - Free/cheaper parking
 - Available and affordable living options
 - o Remove modular classrooms
 - More tutoring/specialized tutoring
- What do we need to fix?
