## THE WAR THIS WEEK

### Sicily Invaded

Invasion of Sicily took the spotlight in the war news this week although bitter fighting is continuing on the Russian and Southwest Pacific fronts.

The attack on Sicily began late Saturday night with the landing of paratroopers and glider-borne troops. Amphibious troops, which included some 2,000 vessels of all sizes, took part in the attack along 100 miles or so of coast. Guns of navy vessels backed up the landing parties.

Little resistance was encountered at first along the coast. Two of the coastal towns, Augusta and Syracuse, given up during the week, surrendered in such haste that their port facilities were not destroyed. This made it easy for the Allies to continue their landing operations.

The Americans seem to be having the hardest fighting on the west flank where the enemy has concentrated its stiffest opposition. Of the many enemy counter-attacks the Americans have thrust back the heaviest on the western flank.
