

Women ,at Lowry Adopt Snappy Garb

Snappy blue uniforms—with brass buttons and everything—are the newest fashion note at Lowry Field.

The wearers are women civilian employes, and wearing of the uniforms is a voluntary matter. However, Miss Margaret Wagner, head of the committee which proposed adoption of the uniform garb, said yesterday its adoption is almost 100 percent among the women workers.

The suits were designed by Mrs. Margaret Galloway, a Lowry employe and a former commercial illustrator and art instructor at Denver University.

The suits consist of a horizon-blue jacket and skirt, with a white blouse. The hat, also designed by Mrs. Galloway, is a feminine version of the cocked overseas cap. The uniform is adorned with air insignia. Its adoption was suggested by the employes.
