Individualized Degree Program: International Studies Concentration Requirements

The Individualized Degree Program International Studies Concentration allows a student, in close consultation with a faculty advisor and the Center for Individualized Learning, to design a course of study that best meets his/her needs, building on the foundation of the core requirements. Additional courses are selected with approval of the student’s advisors. A minor may be required, depending on the number of credits in the major.
