Total Credits Required for the Minor: 18

- At least 3 courses (9 credits) in the Minor must be Upper Division (3000 Level or above), and 6 of these credits must be taken at MSU Denver.
- A grade of "D-" or better counts toward your degree, as long as your overall GPA, Major GPA, and HDFS Minor GPA, are both 2.0 or above.
- Transfer students must have completed both semesters of any 2-semester Introductory/General Psychology courses for them to be considered equivalent to PSY 1001 at MSU Denver. 3 credits will count toward the Minor and 3 credits will count as general electives (PSY 8888). If a student has taken only 1 semester of a 2-semester Introductory/General Psychology course sequence, they must take PSY 1001 at MSU Denver.
