

Tier One, Two, & Three Words

- *Tier One words* are the words of everyday speech usually learned in the early grades.
- *Tier Two words* (academic vocabulary) are far more likely to appear in written texts than in speech, and they appear in all kinds of texts: informational texts (words such as *relative, vary, formulate, specificity, and accumulate*), technical texts (*calibrate, itemize, periphery*), and literary texts (*misfortune, dignified, faltered, unabashedly*).
- *Tier Three words* (domain-specific words) are specific to a domain or field of study (*lava, carburetor, legislature, circumference, aorta*) and key to understanding a new concept within a text.
