

IMPORTANT SPRING 2007 DATES & DEADLINES

***** In-state student's enrollment will not be canceled for non-payment. It is the student's responsibility to drop their classes if they do not plan to attend. *****

1. TUITION AND FEE PAYMENT DEADLINE - Friday, January 12, 2007

State Residents: Payment in full must be received by the cashiers' office (CN 107) by 5:00 p.m. or a 4% service charge will be assessed on the outstanding balance. Financial aid students can avoid service charges by making sure aid is awarded. Apply and authorize the use of the COF stipend towards your tuition before payment deadline to avoid service charges on the state paid portion of your tuition. For information go to www.mscd.edu and click on the College Opportunity Fund.

Non-Residents: For non-resident students who have NOT completed their financial aid file, payment in full must be received by the cashiers' office (CN 107) by 5:00 p.m. or a payment contract must be filed with the Office of Student Accounts' (CN 110). Otherwise, your registration will be canceled.

Sponsorship: Sponsor documents are due in the Office of Student Accounts' (CN 110) or student is responsible for all applicable service charges.

2. REFUND POLICY FOR DROPPING FULL TERM COURSE(S)

For 100% credit of tuition and fees:

Tuesday, January 16, 2007 - Monday, January 22, 2007

For 50% credit of tuition, 100% credit of fees:

Tuesday, January 23, 2007 - Wednesday, January 31, 2007

If you drop a course and then register for another course during the 50% drop refund period, and the transaction does not result in a net reduction in credit hours, no penalty will be assessed.

REFUND POLICY FOR PART-OF-TERM CLASSES

The drop dates are different for part-of-term classes. If you have any number other than 1 under the first column (titled P) of your statement, you have a part-of-term class. For specific refund dates for part-of-term classes, contact the Office of Student Accounts (CN 110) at 303-556-6188.

NO tuition and fee credit will be available after Wednesday, January 31, 2007. If you withdraw and add courses, you will be charged full tuition and fees for the courses withdrawn from and full tuition and fees for the courses added.

3. HEALTH INSURANCE DEADLINE - (10 credit hrs or more)-Wednesday, January 31, 2007

LAST DAY TO WAIVE OR REINSTATE THE MANDATORY STUDENT HEALTH INSURANCE. For insurance questions please call the Student Health Center (PL 150) 303-556-3873. Students enrolled for 10 credit hours or more will be automatically enrolled in the MSCD Student Health insurance program unless they certify that they are currently covered by a comparable health plan that meets the MSCD Health Insurance Waiver Standards. If a student withdraws with no credit (N/C) from a class prior to the Health Insurance waiver deadline, the withdrawn credit hours are counted toward the Health Insurance assessment. **Students who completed a waiver form during the Fall 2006 term do not need to fill out a new waiver for the Spring 2007 term.** Insurance Waivers are on the web at;

Spring 2007 Payment Guide

Plan	Benefits	Details
One and You're Done	Greatest Savings	Pay in full by payment deadline and avoid all service charges. One single payment. Fast and Easy! This plan option allows you to dedicate your time to study rather than finance.
Balloon Plus Two	Cost Effective	Make your largest payment possible by payment deadline and pay the balance in two monthly payments. This payment trio greatly reduces the 4% service charge on payment deadline.
Three and Equal	Keeps You Going	Make three equal monthly payments according to the due dates below. Your account will incur more service charges but will still be fully paid in time for Spring semester registration.
Date Due	Payment	Details
January 12, 2007	First Payment Due	4% service charge added to outstanding balance. Payment Deadline is at 5:00 p.m.
February 9, 2007	Second Payment Due	1.5% service charge added to outstanding balance. Remember, one month left to pay in full.
March 9, 2007	Last Payment Due	1.5% service charge added to outstanding balance. Unpaid balance is considered past due.
Past Due Accounts and Balance Due Holds		
March 12, 2007	Balance Due Hold	These holds are placed on all unpaid accounts without exception! This means no class registration, no grades, no transcripts, no diploma! Balance Due Holds are bad business for your education.
April 2, 2007	Summer/Fall 2007 Registration Begins	Get the classes you want on the days and times you want them. Protect your registration status by keeping your student account current at all times!

Financial Aid	Avoid service charges by making sure your financial aid file is complete at the Office of Financial Aid, CN116, by payment deadline.	
Outside Scholarships	Avoid service charges on your account by taking a copy of your award notice to the Scholarship Center, CN120, by payment deadline.	
Sponsored Students	Avoid service charges by making sure that your letter of credit, or sponsorship voucher, is in our office, CN110, by payment deadline.	
Non-Residents	Avoid cancellation by payment in full, complete financial aid, or signed payment contract in our office, CN110, by payment deadline.
