**There are three parts to this program (described in detail below):**

## 1. GENERAL STUDIES COURSES

When choosing Historical, Arts & Humanities, or Natural and Physical Science General Studies, select at least one class with the Global Diversity attribute.

## 2. MODERN LANGUAGES MAJOR COURSES

The following are the course requirements for your major. Please track progress on your major and other graduation requirements on your CAPP report and **see your Modern Languages advisor regularly**. Your major should be declared with the K-12 Education concentration for the language(s) you are studying. You **do not** need to declare a minor in Secondary Education. Your GPA in your content area coursework must be 2.75 or higher to be accepted for Student Teaching. Modern Languages majors can focus in one or two of the following languages: Spanish, German, French. **Courses required for licensure (notated with a “§” symbol) must be passed with a grade of C or better.** These content area courses also factor in to your Content Area GPA for student teaching.
