Use this document to learn about specific requirements for your major and accompanying teacher licensure courses, and to work with your academic advisors to plan your course of study and track your progress. Visit your advisors. If you major in English and seek licensure in Secondary Education, you will have two advisors:

- One in the Department of English
- One in Secondary Education

Before you can register for most education courses:

- Apply to the School of Education.
- Obtain provisional and/or formal admission to the program. Some courses require provisional admission, while most advanced courses require formal admission.

There are three parts to this program (described in detail below):

1. GENERAL STUDIES COURSES

The following courses meet Colorado content standards for teachers and are the first courses to focus on completing. You need a total of **24 credit hours** from the following list. **All courses required for licensure (notated with a “§” symbol) must be passed with a grade of C or better.**
