1. GENERAL STUDIES COURSES

2. HISTORY MAJOR COURSES

The following are the course requirements for your major. Please track progress on your major and other graduation requirements on your CAPP report and **see your History advisor regularly**. Your major should be declared with the Secondary Education Concentration (HIS1). You **do not** need to declare a minor in Secondary Education. Your GPA in your content area coursework must be 2.75 or higher to be accepted for Student Teaching. **Courses with the “§” symbol are required for licensure and must be passed with a grade of “C” or better. C- or lower is not an acceptable grade for licensure.**

You should complete your General Studies and at least half of your major and additional content area course (Part 3) before beginning Education courses.
