

## Campus Climate Survey Quick Takes

### Spring 2016 Cohort and Metropolitan State University of Denver Overview

The EAB Campus Climate Survey is an anonymous online instrument that assesses students' perceptions, behaviors, attitudes, and experiences with regards to sexual violence during the current academic year.

The survey was administered at **34 institutions** in the U.S. and Canada during the spring 2016 semester. The average response rate was **17%** compared to MSU Denver's response rate of **11%**.

Comparing Aggregate Results to Metropolitan State University of Denver's Spring 2016 Results

### **Perception of Overall Campus Climate**

Respondents who agreed or strongly agreed with the following statements.

I feel safe at this school.	89%	89%	87%
I feel close to people at this school.	72%	74%	51%
I think faculty are genuinely concerned about my welfare.	84%	87%	87%

#### **Overall Sexual Violence Rate**

Respondents who experienced at least one incident of sexual violence at least one time.

Types of sexual violence include unwanted incidents of being fondled, kissed, or rubbed up against, attempted sexual penetration, sexual penetration, attempted oral sex, and oral sex. Respondents most commonly experienced being fondled, kissed, or rubbed up against.

### **Unwanted Sexual Contact Prior to College**

Has anyone had or attempted to have unwanted sexual contact with you prior to going to college?

### **Prevention Training Rates**

Have you received prevention information or training?

A greater share of first year respondents received prevention information or training than all subsequent years. Most spring 2016 cohort respondents received training at new student orientation and found it generally helpful.
