Approval of December's Special Session and January Minutes: Approved unanimously

I. Graduate Curriculum Discussion- Responsibilities

There has been a slight change in the timeline of the approval process due to the new knowledge that HLC will require a full panel review on all graduate programs. This review will take 6-9 months for new graduate programs. HLC is requiring new graduate program to go through all internal processes and through the state prior to HLC submission.

The entire process takes too long. There may be changes in what industry demands then what was originally proposed. Can Graduate Council look at a way for the process to be more nimble to allow for change in a timely fashion.

 - CPS would like to have the curriculum go through the College Committee (agreed to by CLAS and Education). They can follow the same timeline as the Deans.
