EXPLORE CAMPUS



Named after campus president Dr. Stephan Jordan (2005-2017) the Jordan Student Success Building is a one-stop-shop for everything. Students start here even before day one with the Office of Admissions clear through the day they graduate. Students voted to build this campus hub and it was recently renovated with Roadrunners in mind, adding study areas, nap cubes and a lounge. Financial Aid, Advising and even the current MSU Denver President, Janine Davidson Ph.D., can be found here.

The Tivoli is the center for cultural and social activities. Not only will yo find a full food court, you'll also find a range of student offices: Student Activities, Student Government, the LGBTO Resource Center, Veteran and Military Services and the Counseling Center just to name a few. There are ever 120 student clubs and organizations at MSU Denver. While you're in the Tivoli, be sure to also check out the brewing labs and Tivoli brewing company. This is just one example of true, hands-on learning for students.

And Hospitality Learning Center

The Hospitality Learning Center or HLC, hosts classes in unique spaces like a sensory analysis lab and a cellar management classroom with temperature-controlled space for more than 3,000 bottles of wine! Inside the HLC you can also find high-tech demonstration kitchens and 'Degree', a student-run restaurant. Attached to the HLC is the Marriott Spring Hill Suites - a fully functioning hotel where students work and learn while in school. There are only 10 other learning hotels like it in the country.

The newly renovated PE Center is where you can watch the champion Roadrunner basketball team along with a variety of other sports. MSU Denver is the only school on Campus with NCAA II Division athletics. This building includes a full basketball court, dance studios and an outdoor oursuits program. As a student, you can participate in intramural and club sports as well as workout in the Campus Fitness Center which ncludes a climbing wall, exercise



The Science Building is relatively new to the Auraria Campus. Inside, you will find classrooms and facilities including a cadaver lab. MSU Denver made science, technology, and math education a priority with more than 6,000 students majoring in these fields. Many students have the chance to do research working directly with professors. In this building enjoy a cup of coffee from the cafe and be sure to look up at the butterfly comprised of test tubes filled with live bacteria.

ATHLETICS AT THE TIC COMPLEX


Just across Colfax, visible from campus is the Regency Athletic Complex. This is where MSU Denver athletes practice, train and play. The new complex includes the 20,000 square foot Cohen Center that houses team locker, training and weight





The Auraria Library is the only tri-institutional academic library in the country - used by students from all three schools on campus. The library has nearly 700,000 volumes and offers access to countless digital resources. In addition to books, students can check out laptops, calculators, cameras and even anatomical skeletons. Inside, there is a 3D Printing Lab on the main floor and a number of TV studios on the lower level. The Library features a recent addition of solar panels covering the roof to help sustainably fuel campus

This is the heart of campus where many classes take place. Walking oridges connect the Arts, Central Classroom and West Classroom buildings so you can get from one building to another. Great for those snowy days! The Arts Building is home to many creative classes including visual arts, music and theatre. MSU Denver is the only school in Colorado where all fine and performing arts programs are fully accredited. As you walk through the building, the art on display was created by students and faculty.





9th Street, Denver's oldest block of restored houses built between 1872 and 1906, was initially settled by immigrants as a part of the original Auraria neighborhood - the namesake of campus. In the 1960's, the area was converted into the Auraria campus. Today, these houses are occupied by offices, resources and restaurants for students and staff. While you're here, check out areas to study, eat, or even fix your bike at one of the fix-it stations on campus.

The King Center is the place to be or concerts, musicals and plays! students learn every aspect of troduction from backstage to the potlight. Any MSU Denver student an audition, volunteer or attend rorductions for free! Inside, there are hree black box theatres and several other spaces including the Rawls Thetre modeled after the Globe. It's one of only three of its kind in the world. Students might also use this building on get free assistance from the writing lenter.





The newest addition to campus - and winner of the Downtown Denver Award for impact on the Mile High City - is the Aerospace and Engineer-ng Sciences (AES) Building. The state-of-the-art facility includes a large scale 3D printer in the Lockheed Martin Lab and a 50 percent scale model of NASA's Orion spacecraft on the top Ploor. You'll also find a range of Public-Private Partnerships, including York Space Systems, providing students internships, joint research projects and jobs.



IN THE ART DISTRICT

The award-winning Center for Visual Art (CVA) is located off campus in the Santa Fe Arts District. The CVA provides a bridge from campus into the community and is free to the public and students alike. The exhibits change regularly so stop by throughout the year.
