Summary of Budget Task Force Proposed Changes

- Increase tuition rates by 3% for both resident and non-resident undergraduate students (or \$7.80 per credit hour for a resident & \$24.30 per credit hour for non-resident)
- Assume a 3% decline in enrollment
- Close the tuition window by 50% for FY2019-20 and another 50% in FY2021-22
- Increase all the MSU Denver fees by 5% to cover the CPI
- Increase the Post Tenure Reviews (PTRs) from \$2,000 to \$3,000
- Cover Mandatory Costs of \$4 M in Phase I
- Cover \$1.6 M in Student Services and High Impact Practices from Tuition Window Closing.

FY2018-19 State Support

\$120.7 M increase to Public Higher Education (HE); nearly 13% of 1 billion HE Budget:

Need based grants = \$23 M Public Higher Education = \$97.7 M



\$17 M allocated to Specialty Programs (CU & CSU) \$80.7 M allocated to Public Higher Education Including Local District and Area Technical



Almost **\$77 million remaining** to be allocated through HB1319 or about 13% increase for each institution



MSU Denver's additional state support is \$7.18 million or 12.7% increase for total Base state support of nearly \$64 million

Mandatory Base New Allocations

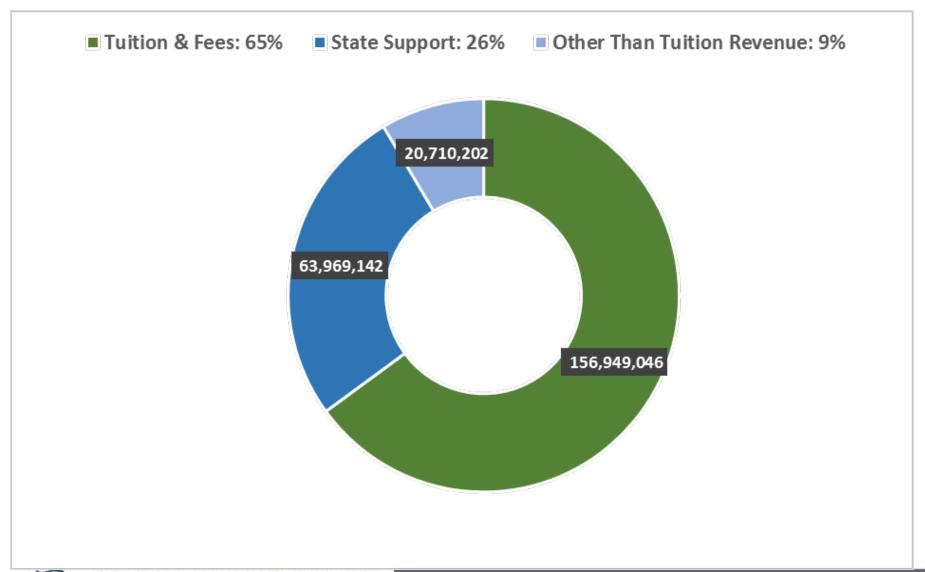
FY19-20 total mandatory base increases of \$4 million:

- ✓ Estimated fringe benefit increases (est. health insurance) are approximately \$454K
- ✓ AHEC and library increases of approximately \$880K
- ✓ Faculty promotions, tenure, and post-tenure reviews is about \$651K
- ✓ Other ongoing contracts including IT \$852K
- ✓ State-wide minimum wage increase \$450K
- ✓ Classified personnel increase (3% COLA & merit including fringe increases) \$329K
- ✓ Athletic Scholarships \$51K
- ✓ Mid-year CUPA adjustments \$372

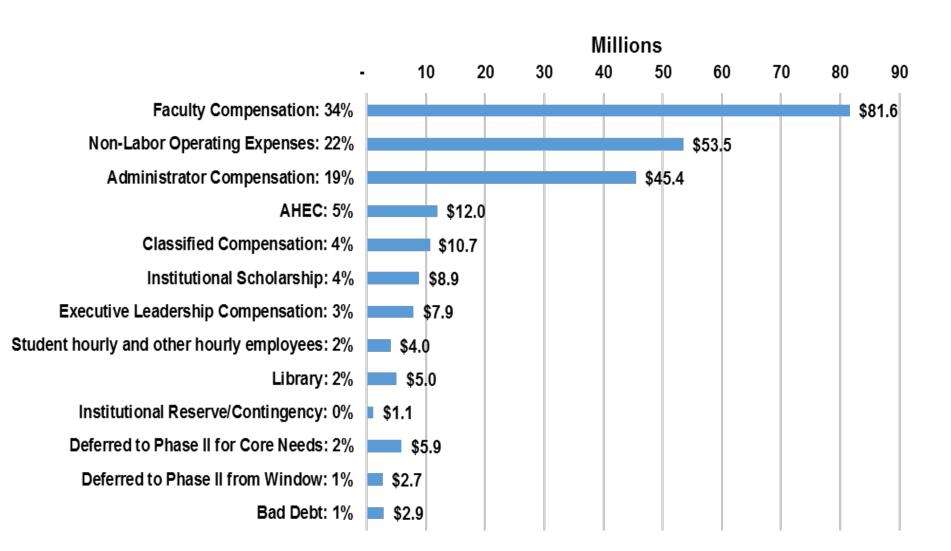
Proposed Spending from Tuition Window Closing

- Invest \$1,588,728 in high impact practices for student retention and graduation.
 - Includes investing in supplemental academic instruction, learning assistants, mentors, etc.
- Continue to identify best practices, academic needs, and other areas that impact student outcomes over the summer months to bring to the Board in September.

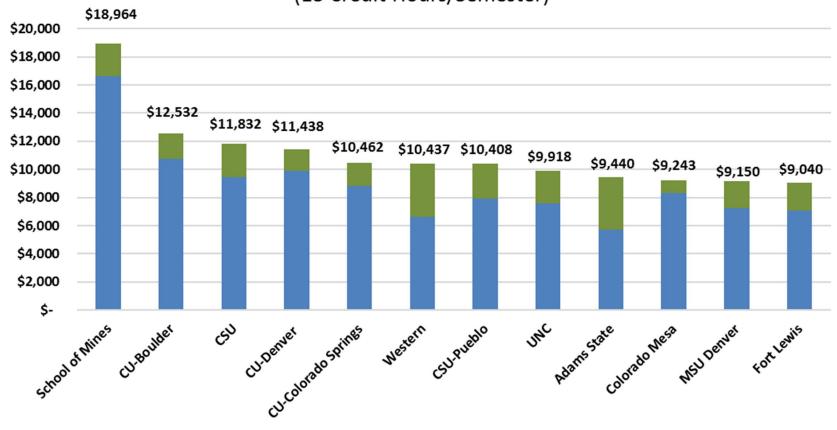

(15 Credit Hours/Semester)



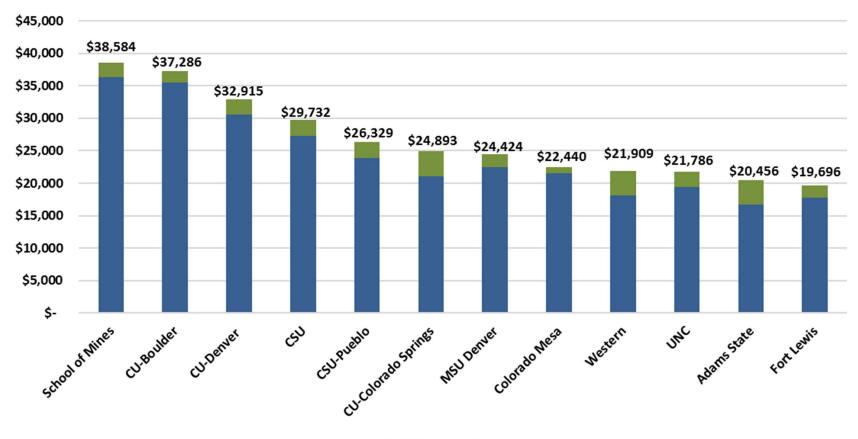
■ Tuition ■ Fees

Resident Students Multi-Year Tuition & Fees

- FY 2019-20, 50% closing window impact with 3% tuition increase.
- FY 2020-21, **no changes** to the closing window and no tuition increase.
- FY 2021-22, 50% closing window impact with no tuition increase.
- FY 2022-23, **no changes** to the closing window and no tuition increase.
- Assumed increasing the fees by 5% for MSU Denver and 3.9% for AHEC Fees.
