Are you preparing graduate school applications for Fall 2022 admissions? Many programs require taking exams that aim to measure general knowledge or test field-specific information (law and medical school, teaching, and others). Explore some of the most common graduate admissions tests below:

<u>General GRE (Graduate Records Examinations)</u>: Standardized exam that tests general knowledge. It focuses on verbal and quantitative reasoning, critical thinking and analytical writing skills. Commonly required by many majors. <u>Administered by ETS (Educational Testing Service)</u>.

- Fee: \$205.00
- GRE Fee Reduction Program: This is administered by ETS, not MSU Denver
- Free prep materials: Prepare for the GRE General Test (For Test Takers) (ets.org)

<u>GRE Subject Tests</u>: Tests knowledge in specific fields. Check the program pre-requisites or requirements to see if you need to take the test for admissions consideration. The *four disciplines with GRE Subject Tests are: <u>Psychology</u>, Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry

- Fee: \$150.00
- *Always verify if the program you are applying for requires a subject test. Not all graduate programs require subject tests

<u>GMAT (Graduate Management Admission Test)</u>: Measures field-specific skills for those applying to business graduate programs.

- Fee: \$250

LSAT (Law School Admission Test): Tests skills necessary t=for success in the first year of law school including reading comprehension, reasoning and writing.

• Fee: \$200.00

MCAT (Medical College Admission Test): Developed and administer by the <u>AAMC (Association of</u> <u>American Medical Colleges)</u>, the MCAT assess problem solving, critical thinking, and knowledge of natural, behavioral, and social science concepts and principles as prerequisite to studying medicine.

• Fee: \$320.00

Financial Assistance to take Graduate School Entrance Tests available! Read more below:

Through the Center for Multicultural Engagement & Inclusion (CMEI) students can receive financial assistance for their graduate school admissions exams and/or prep materials and courses. The Graduate School Entrance Exam & Professional Licensure Program is a student fee funded resource that provides financial assistance for students looking to complete a graduate school entrance exam (GRE, LSAT, MCAT, etc.) OR complete a certification/licensure course or exam that is directly related to their area of study or leadership position on campus. Students are eligible to receive up to \$400 per fiscal year (July 1-June 30). These funds can be used for exam registration fees, graduate school entrance exam preparation courses, study guides, or fees for licensure or certification completion.
