Triburgo came to CVA during the exhibition to present a talk about *Policing Gender* and the pen pal relationships that started the project.


This week's session will take a hard look at the justice system and might challenge your ideas about how it should function.

Featured Artist - Lorenzo Triburgo

Lorenzo Triburgo addresses the invisibility of incarcerated members of the queer community, particularly those who are transgendered, through his series, *Policing Gender*. Lorenzo uses audio of interviews with LGBTQ prisoners and ambient sounds of prison layered over photographs to "challenge viewers to consider their privilege of looking and objectifying individuals on society's margins."

The series grew out of Triburgo's correspondence with over 35 LGBTQ individuals that were incarcerated in Pacific Northwestern prisons. The hardships prisoners face are amplified for those that are LGBTQ, who are often bullied and assaulted for being "other". Receiving mail from outside the prison indicates that someone on the outside is paying attention to what happens to them while in prison, thus reducing their risk of harassment.
