





The College of Health and Applied Sciences has over 7,000 majors in our twelve departments

The College houses 75% of MSU Denver's graduate programs The College's total graduate program headcounts have grown by over 180% since 2018-2019

Women make up nearly 84% of CHAS graduate students





- Advanced Manufacturing Sciences welcomed the U.S. Secretary of Labor Marty Walsh for a meeting on industry apprenticeships visit.
- Aviation and Aerospace Science received the FAA Part 141 certification for flight and ground training and received a DHSI grant to set up the Colorado Space Tech program.
- **Computer Sciences** participated in the National Security Agency's National Centers of Academic Excellence in Cybersecurity, Cybersecurity Education Diversity Initiative grant and had a successful ABET reaccreditation.
- Criminal Justice and Criminology's Dr. Allison Cotton now sits on the the Criminal Justice Cabinet for Colorado Senator James Coleman and Dr. Jia and Dr. London continue to work on economic and educational initiatives for their Cybersecurity programs.





- Engineering and Engineering Technology successfully completed an ABET accreditation visit and continues to grow their Construction Project Management program
- Health Professions launched a new Public Health program and continues to grow their Master of Health Administration program
- Human Performances and Sport held their The 5th annual Women in Sport Management Panel and Networking Event that included Megan Scremin, President & CEO of Special Olympics Colorado; Shana Ferguson, Chief Commercial Officer, USA Swimming; Arielle Orsuto, Sports Reporter for 9News Denver; and Stephanie Zoesch, Compliance Development Coordinator for U.S. Center for SafeSport and MSU Denver Alumni and their Sport Management program ranked #8 in nation and "Best in the West" in Intelligent Best Sport Management Degree Programs of 2022.





- Human Services and Counseling worked with the Colorado Women's Chamber of Commerce to look at the "SheCession" the great resignation as experienced by women. Six of their Fire and Emergency Response Administration graduates completed the Denver Fire Department's Recruit Academy.
- Industrial design is developing a department magazine that showcases the work of students, faculty, and alumni. One of their graduates, Schuyler Livingston, helped designed a musical alarm clock that is now sold at the Museum of Modern Art.
- Nursing obtained ACEN reaccreditation for seven years with no recommendations for change and CCNE accreditation for five years with no recommendations for change. Nursing developed a new innovative academic -clinical partnership between Denver Health which includes more clinical placements and paid student externships.





- Nutrition the Dietetic Internship was selected by the Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics as
 the recipient of their 2021 Diversity and Inclusion Action Award. In September, the PostBaccalaureate Opportunities for Hispanic Americans (POHA) Program in the Department
 of Nutrition hosted its first annual Nutrition Diversity Conference.
- **Social Work** continues to run an excess of \$1 million dollars in grants per year that focus on Colorado Workforce Scholarship Trainings. Social Work recently celebrated their ten years of granting Master's degrees and twenty-five years of granting Bachelor's degrees.
- Speech Language Hearing Sciences will welcome its inaugural cohort to its Master of Science in Speech-Language Pathology in June 2022. The admission's committee received close to 100 applications for this first cohort. In March, the Scottish Rite Foundation of Colorado named SLHS a RiteCare partner and awarded the department a \$50,000 Treasure Chest Program Grant.





Our Directors are Amazing!

- Advanced Manufacturing Sciences Institute Director Mark Yoss continues to work with partners on Clean Energy Training programs and the Associated General Contractors.
- *Cybersecurity Center* Director Richard Mac Namee established a live Security Operations Center and secured access for operation PISCES in Colorado.
- **Health Institute** Director Emily Matuszewicz secured funds for the Wellness Challenge and the Health Institute is the recipient of the Bank of America Progresando Initiative.

- We are the only program in the U.S. that has a LEED Gold® certified hotel, a commercial conference space, a state-of-the-art beverage testing laboratory, a commercial restaurant, and a working brewery on campus.
- The Hospitality Leadership program launched in Fall 2020, and as of Spring 2022 we have 107 declared majors.
- We are one of just four universities that offer a B.S. in Event and Meeting Management and the only university that also offers a B.S. in Brewery Operations.







A new beer lab! MSU Denver is building a new 3.5bbl brewing lab to give students an opportunity to work on a professional system on a regular basis.

We are raising funds to name it after brewing legend Charlie Papazian, founder of the Brewers Association, American Homebrewers Association and the Great American Beer Festival.

- Hosted Sage Hospitality for a Community Service Project for 110 Sage Hotel and Restaurant leaders.
- Our volunteers and the leaders packaged 1500 bags of dehydrated food equivalent to 6000 servings for We Don't Waste.







Innovations/Uniqueness



- Professor Smita Singh published research in the Journal of Hospitality and Tourism Management entitled: "Use of service robots in an event setting: Understanding the role of social presence, eeriness, and identity threat".
- The paper discusses the use of service robots in the event industry and how the interaction with such technologies shape customers.



 Partnering with the Colorado Tourism Office in 2021, the Meeting and Events Incentive has already raised half a million dollars for the hospitality program.


Vision & Mission


