Getting Started

We hope the following information and resources can be used to help guide you along your major exploration journey. Remember, exploration is a process. This is a time to reflect on what brings you joy, what your talents are, and what holds value in your life. And once you are able to reflect (and research possibilities), the goal is to identify majors and careers that align with these areas.



At MSU Denver, we use the term "exploratory" because being undecided is about being open to discovery. We want you to know that exploring your major options is completely normal (and encouraged)! Up to 50% of students enter college undecided about their major choice, and nearly 75% of students will change their major at least once during their college experience. You are not alone in this process, and the MSU Denver Exploratory Advising Office is here to support you along this journey!

EXPLORE... By learning about your degree options

MSU Denver offers 90+ majors, 90+ minors, 10 graduate programs, 40 certificates, and a customizable degree program. Check out the following resources to explore MSU Denver programs.

- ☐ You can view a full list of MSU Denver programs in the <u>University Catalog</u>. It is important to note some majors have prescribed general studies courses, may require an application, or have other special degree requirements. If you have any questions about degree requirements, you can always ask an advisor!

Keep in mind...

Choosing your major is an important decision, but it will not define the rest of your life. No matter which degree you pursue, you will be gaining valuable skills and experiences that will complement any path you go down.

- ☐ Use the <u>Major Exploration and Reflection</u> exercise to help explore MSU Denver majors and reflect on the possibilities. Meet with an Exploratory Advisor to discuss your findings.
- ☐ Consider taking an exploratory/introductory course in a major of interest. These courses will introduce you to the field of study and help you explore the different programs available at MSU Denver. Check out our Exploratory Pathway Guides for course ideas based on your majors of interest!
- ☐ Meet with faculty/advisors in the areas you are interested in to gain additional insight on specific majors that relate to your interests and career goals.



EXPLORE... By learning about your values, interests, and strengths

As you embark on your exploration journey, you will want to identify what is important to you (your values), what you enjoy/love doing (your interests), and what you do well (your strengths). Think about how these areas align with your career goals. Check out the following resources to explore your values, interests, and strengths.

☐ Meet with a career counselor in the <u>Classroom to Career Hub</u>. Our career counselors are a great resource for students that are exploring careers and trying to identify what aligns with their passions, interests, strengths, and goals. ☐ Complete a career assessment. Career assessments can help you identify your interests, values, strengths, and other important traits and how they relate to the world of work. They may help open your eyes to potential careers that align with these traits.

☐ Through our <u>Classroom to Career Hub</u>, you can complete the Myers-Briggs Type Indicator (MBTI) or the Strong Interest Inventory (fees apply to these assessments). Upon completion of the assessment(s), you can meet for an in-depth appointment with a <u>career counselor</u> to evaluate your results. You can also check out these free online assessments: <u>O*NET Interest Profiler</u> and the <u>MyMajor's College Major Assessment</u>

- ☐ Reflection questions to ask yourself:
 - What inspired me to go to college? How can I make the most of my college experience?
 - What makes my life (and work) meaningful? What holds value in my life?
 - What is one thing I am most proud of? What makes it significant in my life?
 - What subjects/classes have I performed well in? What subjects do I not particularly enjoy?

EXPLORE... By doing major and career research

- ☐ Get involved on campus and in the community. Volunteer at a non-profit that aligns with your values. Attend a campus event or join a student club in an area you are interested in.
- ☐ Job shadow or intern at an organization that you want to learn more about. Getting experience in the field can show you what it is like to work in a profession. It's also a great way to network with industry experts! You can login to Career Link to access job and internship opportunities!

- □ Request an informational interview with a professional that works in the field you are interested in. An informational interview is a conversation that allows you to receive career advice, examine career fields, gather industry knowledge, and network with industry insiders.
- ☐ Consider having a career conversation with an MSU Denver alum through the <u>Alumni Advisor Network</u>.
