
Criminalistics Minor

Students must complete 24 semester hours, plus associated prerequisites within the framework of specific courses, to qualify for a minor in Criminalistics.

A grade of "C-" or better is required for each course in this program to count toward the minor. Students should note that programs differ in the minimum grade required.

Required Courses:

- **CHE 1100-Principles of Chemistry (4)**
- **CHE 1150-Principles of Chemistry Laboratory (1)**

OR

- **CHE 1800-General Chemistry I (4)**
- **CHE 1811-General Chemistry Laboratory II (1)**

In addition, the below are required:

- **CHE 2710-Intro to Criminalistics (3)**
- **CHE 2711-Intro to Criminalistics (1)**
- **CHE 3600-Crime Scene Investigation 1 (4)**
- ***CJC 4650-Ethics in the Criminal Justice Profession (3)**

***CJC 4650 requires CJC 1010-Intro to the Criminal Justice System (3) to be taken first.**
