

Hawkins Center for Excellence Scholarships Requirements

- Scholarships to DPS paraprofessionals in <u>Designated DPS</u> <u>Qualifying Schools</u> with an interest in becoming teachers or bilingual specialists in DPS.
- Historically under-served populations (i.e., racial/ethnic diverse, First-Generation, LGBTQ, and/or students with disabilities)







Designated DPS Qualifying Schools

- More than 70% of students are eligible for a free/reduced price lunch
- Schools with over 80% Minority population

Hawkins Center for Excellence Scholarships – Benefits

- Scholarships are based on a sliding scale (depending on number of credits)
- Includes additional supports for new MSU Denver SOE students
 - Affinity groups
 - Co-teaching
 - Academic Communities





Scholarship from MSU Denver

To receive scholarship, students need to declare they want to major in education on their MSU Denver application.

To receive the Bilingual Specialist rate, students need to declare they want to major in education on their application and enroll in a Bilingual Specialist course taught in Spanish.



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Hawkins Center for Excellence Scholarships – Requirements



- A minimum 2.5 grade point average
- Complete the FASFA or CASFA
- Two recommendations (peer and school/district leader)
- Commitment to preparing for the Praxis exam
- Participate in Zoom interview

Hawkins Center for Excellence Scholarship Maintenance and Academic Probation

Maintenance of Scholarship

- Maintain at least a 2.75 GPA
- Maintain a C or better in all courses
- Actively prepare for the Praxis exam
- Remain in DPS throughout the scholarship

Academic Probation

- Placed on Academic probation if below the requirements in the first semester
- If a student does not meet requirements, they will not be accepted in the scholarship program in the following year





Essay Questions

- What has been your most impactful learning experience thus far (please explain why)? This could be a formal lesson, an in-class experience, a project you developed, etc.
- All Colorado teachers must pass the State Licensure Praxis exam. What will you do to prepare yourself early on to be successful?
- What qualities do you have that will support you in being a successful teacher (i.e., transferable skills, and/or personal characteristics)?
- How will this scholarship support your personal and professional goals? Why are you
 considering a teaching pathway now? What kept you from completing a teacher licensure
 program in the past?
- Your Mission. In one sentence, state your mission as an aspiring educator. For example, "I will learn to make a difference in _____ (your interests) through _____ (your plans for learning and contributing)."






Application Check



Second Year – Sustainable Application



In addition to considerations in first year, subsequent year applications will

- Require a short explanation of their Praxis status – Have they passed the Praxis yet? If not, what have they been doing to practice for it?
- Address their grade point average and above C status
- Address Standard IV of the Quality Teacher Standards: Teachers demonstrate professionalism through ethical conduct, reflection, and leadership.
