Designed for students who want an in-depth study in the area of language translation, the Translation Studies minor prepares students for applied language services as translation providers or as translation editors. The Department of World Languages is collaborating with the Departments of English, Sociology and Anthropology, and Communication Arts and Sciences to create this minor.

The Translation Studies minor is customizable for:

- Students with advanced language skills
- Students who are at the beginning of their language studies
- Students with limited or no previous exposure to foreign languages

This minor requires a catalog major.
