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


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


2023-2024 Child Welfare Scholars 57 Scholars!



Timing:


- Measured in the fall (once) and spring (annually)

Measures:


- Child welfare competency

In what ways has receiving a scholarship influenced your plans for child welfare work after you graduate?

- "It allowed me to be able to go to school. I don't know that I would've been able to without the support. It helped me look further at my "why" and get clear about my career."
- "It is an incentive to continue working in the field....I do not have to scramble to figure out what to do after graduation, I get to continue developing as a professional and doing meaningful work, and I am not burdened by the loans that the stipend has replaced."



With eight years of data collection, we are finding consistent trends in that:

All scholars made significant gains in their knowledge and understanding of Colorado child welfare policies and practice.

Scholars feel ready and prepared for child welfare work:

- 100% of scholars felt committed to the wellbeing of children and families.
- 94% of scholars reported they are excited about applying their learning to their job in child welfare.
- **78%** of scholars reported they are committed to work in child welfare for 4 years or more.
