Typically the unrestricted elective credits will vary between 22 and 25 credit hours. These hours may be used to meet requirements for a minor or a concentration. As per University policy, no more than 16 semester hours in human performance and sport activities (HPL), 4 semester hours of varsity sports (ATH) and no more than 7 semester hours in music ensemble courses will be counted toward the degree.
