### SUGGESTED FINANCE CAREER ROADMAP

#### **First Year (0-29 Credits - EXPLORE)**

- Meet with a Classroom to Career Hub Career Counselor
- Take a Career Test, Attend Career workshops, and Explore Majors/Careers

#### **Second Year (30-59 Credits – EXPLORE)**

- Research occupations, attend Employer Panels, write a resume

**No Concentration (18 credits).** In consultation with a faculty or academic advisor, students will take 6 approved Real Estate Electives

**OPEN ELECTIVES.** Students must take a minimum of 120 total credits to graduate. Business students typically require between 9 and 15 credits of open electives to get to 120 credits.
