

Need a smallbusiness loan? Your character counts

Public-private partnership helps entrepreneurs close the gap between concept and collateral.

What if you could qualify for a smallbusiness loan on the strength of your character?

It's possible with MSU Denver's Small Business Loan Program, a public-private partnership with Alpine Bank and Prairie Rose Development Corp. launched in August 2022. The program, which offers University-affiliated businesses access to character-based loans ranging from \$5,000 to \$50,000 to help them launch or grow, is facilitated by generous donor gifts to the MSU Denver Foundation and Foundation deposits into a reserve fund.

Wait. Character-based?

Traditional lenders primarily focus on a business owner's credit score and ability to repay the loan with other resources if they default. Prairie Rose Development, a nonprofit bridging the space between entrepreneurs and lenders like Alpine Bank, focuses on a borrower's character and capacity.

"Character" concerns how smallbusiness owners have prepared to succeed. "Capacity" is how they demonstrate, on paper, cash-flow projections and other considerations.

"If someone has the appropriate character and capacity, we don't need to plan on the business not succeeding," said Mike O'Donnell, Prairie Rose's executive director.

Former students get opportunity to get back into the classroom

Across the U.S., 39 million people have taken some college classes but never graduated. One of the top reasons for stopping out is the cost. And when tuition and fee balances end up in collections, it can feel like it's impossible to realize the dream of earning a degree.

Metropolitan State University of Denver wants to change that.

The Bursar's Grant – founded in November 2022 by MSU Denver Board of Trustees member Jerry Glick – provides former MSU Denver students with a clear path for getting back into the classroom, where they can achieve their educational goals and ambitions.

"I am convinced that coming back to school and getting a degree or certificate is the key to accomplishing what you want in life," said Glick, managing partner of Columbia Group LLP. "Getting these students reenrolled and their debt paid off benefits the student, the University and the community."

Attorney and activist Dawn Bookhardt, J.D., is dedicated to helping Metropolitan State University of Denver educate a diverse health care workforce in the fields of speech, language and hearing.

The chair of the MSU Denver Foundation board of directors recently made a transformational \$1 million gift toward the construction of a new 70,000-square-foot health education building that will allow the University to bring its health-related academic programs under one roof.

That includes the Speech, Language and Hearing Sciences program, an area of health care near and dear to Bookhardt. Her gift will also help support the Bookhardt Family Speech and Language Clinic within the Health Institute Facility. The clinic was recently renamed in Bookhardt's honor.

"I want to change the dynamics of speech, hearing and language education and careers — for people from all racial and ethnic backgrounds to be part of it," said Bookhardt, a longtime MSU Denver supporter. "I'm putting my money where my mouth is."

More MSU Denver students will gain career-readiness training thanks to recent gift

\$1.5 million donation from the Morgridge Family Foundation supports construction and expansion of the University's C2 Hub.

The Classroom to Career Hub (C2 Hub) at Metropolitan State University of Denver received a financial contribution from the Morgridge Family Foundation that will help take the program to new heights.

The \$1.5 million gift will support the planned construction of a four-story, 25,000-square-foot space that would allow the C2 Hub to better serve the career development of approximately 17,000 MSU Denver students and 11,000 Community College of Denver students annually.

By engaging students, faculty members and industry partners to design and implement career-readiness programs and services, the C2 Hub produces the skilled talent Colorado employers need.

At the event announcing the gift, President Janine Davidson, Ph.D., said one of the University's goals has been "to create an innovative national model that would connect students with employers, not at the end of their degree program but from the moment they set foot on campus."

"We're going to transform Colorado and students' lives through the opportunity to work and achieve their highest potential," she said.

New endowment will help Special Education students thrive

Inspired by his late wife and a career change late in life, alumnus Eddy Reyes establishes a scholarship to help aspiring teachers make a difference.

Eddy Reyes knows it's never too late to change careers — and lives.

Following a successful career in advertising, Reyes shifted gears in his 60s, earning a degree in Special Education from MSU Denver He taught fourth and fifth grade with Denver Public Schools for 18 years. Now in his 80s, he's putting on his philanthropist hat and giving back to the community by honoring his late wife through the Arlen M. Selu Special Education Memorial Endowment — the first scholarship at MSU Denver for students studying Special Education.

Reyes hopes the scholarship will plant seeds for the next generation of Special Education students at the University.
