MSU Denver as a Hispanic-Serving Institution



HSI: Defined

A Hispanic-Serving Institution (HSI) is a college or university federally designated by the U.S. Department of Education with:

- 25% or more total undergraduate Latino full-time equivalent (FTE) student enrollment.
- 50% or more of students received federal need-based aid and
- Core expenses per FTE are lower than the average institutional group.

Seal of Excelencia

The Seal of Excelencia is a national certification by Excelencia in Education that is given to Hispanic-Serving Institutions that have demonstrated a commitment to intentionally serve Latinx Students.



MSU Denver's Journey to HSI Designation

1970

The Chicana/o Studies program was started at MSU Denver.

The first Latino Graduation was held for seven graduating students.

1997 The Richard T. Castro Distinguished Visiting Professorship was initiated.

2007

The HSI Task Force was established in the summer and began meeting in the fall. An HSI Task Force proposal template was created for recommendations to move the initiative forward.



2012

In June, the MSU Denver Board of Trustees initiated a special tuition rate for Colorado's undocumented students to earn their degree. This was prior to the passage of the ASSET Bill in 2013.



2019

On February 19, MSU Denver became a federally designated Hispanic-Serving Institution.

MSU Denver's Department of Nutrition received \$2 million as the first HSI grant, Post-baccalaureate Opportunities for Hispanic Americans.

2006

An ad-hoc committee studied the feasibility of the University becoming a Hispanic-Serving Institution. President Stephen Jordan initiated a goal for MSU Denver to become an HSI.

2008

A report was presented early this year with 55 recommendations, 16 being prioritized recommendations and one of which being support of what would become the ASSET Bill.



2016

MSU Denver's HSI Task Force released the report Connecting the Dots: Report and Recommendations.



2020

MSU Denver received a **Developing** Hispanic-Serving Institutions Program grant of \$2.9 million.

2021

The University was awarded a \$1 million National Science Foundation grant for Building Identity Leading to Diversity (BUILD) at MSU Denver.

2023

MSU Denver earns the **Seal of Excelencia** 3-year Certification.




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Fall 2023 Statistics (Undergraduate Students)

ESCALA Faculty Development
