Concurrent Enrollment

Programs are available with no tuition cost for the student. They provide a head start on the collegiate journey, allowing students to get to graduation more quickly.



Dual Enrollment

Programs are available at a reduced tuition cost for Colorado high school students. They provide a head start on the collegiate journey, allowing students to get to graduation more quickly



Virtual Network

- Select online courses available ONLY to Colorado high school students to take online
- Taught by MSU Denver instructors and are completely online and asynchronous.

ASCENT/TREP

- ASCENT (5th year program) is a program offered by MSU Denver that allows eligible high school students to participate in concurrent enrollment (CE) the year after the 12th grade, enroll in college courses, and earn college credit at no tuition cost to them or their families
 - TREP (5th and 6th year program) is a program offered by MSU Denver that allows eligible high school students to participate in concurrent enrollment (CE) the two years after the 12th grade, enroll in college courses, and earn college credit at no tuition cost to them or their families



Benefits of College Credit in High School

- Increase your likelihood of earning a degree Students navigate college processes and the challenges of college. As a result, they are less likely to drop out and more likely to complete a degree
- Save time Students typically will spend less time in college and more time in their career
- Save money CE or DE students end up saving hundreds or even thousands of dollars in tuition
- ➤ Test the waters -CE or DE can be a great chance to try college out without the risk of paying hundreds or thousands of dollars!
