DPD Post-Baccalaureate Certificate Coursework

The Didactic Program in Dietetics (DPD) Certificate provides students with the knowledge and skills required to pursue a dietetic internship to ultimately become a registered dietitian nutritionist (RDN). Students with a bachelor's degree who have not already obtained a DPD verification statement are eligible to enroll in the Certificate Program.
