





# Culture Dive: Juneteenth's Significance & **Emancipation Worldwide**

luneteenth is an American holiday that commemorates the emancipation of enslaved African Americans on June 19, 1865. This date marks the day when Union General Gordon Granger arrived in Galveston, Texas and announced the end of slavery in accordance with President Abraham Lincoln's Emancipation Proclamation, which had actually been issued two and a half years earlier.

Juneteenth has inspired other countries to reflect on their own histories of slavery and discrimination. In countries with similar histories, such as in the Caribbean and parts of Africa, Juneteenth has influenced the way they commemorate their own emancipation days and liberation movements. Conversely, the concept of Emancipation Days, which are celebrated in various countries around the world, has influenced the way Juneteenth is recognized and celebrated in the US.



### **Emancipation Day-International**

The importance of emancipation is not limited to the United States; its impact reverberates around the world.
