**\*Global Diversity (GD):** Students may fulfill the Global Diversity requirement by taking an approved course within one of the following categories: Arts and Humanities; Historical; Natural and Physical Sciences; or Social and Behavioral Sciences. These courses are blue below.

**Ethnic Studies & Social Justice (ESSJ):** Though not a General Studies category, the ESSJ graduation requirement of 3 credits *can* be met with some General Studies courses. The General Studies courses that carry this additional ESSJ designation are labeled accordingly and listed in red below. A separate list of *all* the ESSJ courses is available in the catalog and on the General Studies website. Students on older catalogs who need to fulfill their **Multicultural** requirement may use ESSJ courses to do so.

## Written Communication

Students take a CO-1 (beginning writing) and a CO-2 (intermediate writing) or, in some cases, students might take a CO-2 (intermediate writing) and a CO-3 (advanced writing). Students doing the first option must finish these courses in their first 45 credits. Students doing the second must finish these courses in their first 90 credits. Students need 6 credits in this category. AP, IB, CLEP, DSST, and Department Exams can provide credit for CO-1 and/or CO-2 courses.
