This process helps manage finances efficiently, avoid high conversion fees, and establish a good financial history in the U.S.

While small talk is particularly prevalent in the United States, it's not exclusive to American culture. Countries like the United Kingdom, Canada, and Australia also engage in small talk frequently. However, the topics and contexts can vary widely. For example, in the UK, discussing the weather is a common small talk topic, but in Japan, small talk might revolve around seasonal changes or local events.



The prevalence of small talk varies significantly based on cultural norms.
