

About Bridge




GITA's annual Bridge Speaker event serves as a bridge between Black History Month in February and Women's History Month in March, and we are excited to be celebrating another year of strong empowering voices. Dr. García Peña is a Latinx Studies scholar, activist and writer. Currently, she serves as Professor in the Effron Center for the Study of America and the Department of African American Studies at Princeton University. Through a transnational, multidisciplinary lens, grounded on humanistic approaches to history and literature, García Peña studies blackness, colonialism, migration and diaspora with a special focus on Black Latinx. Her work is concerned with the ways in which antiblackness and xenophobia intersect in the Global North producina categories of exclusion that lead to violence and erasure. Her research insists on highlighting the knowledge, cultural, social and political contributions of people who have been silenced from traditional archives paying attention to the intersections of blackness, colonialism and migration, and centering Black Latinx lives.

Empowering Choice: The Fight for Reproductive Justice in Colorado

Let's talk about reproductive justice. With the overturning of Roe v. Wade, many states have enacted policies that both restrict abortion access, but also criminalize it. In Colorado we are lucky to have access to abortion care. Any state that is still providing this reproductive care, however, is just a ballot measure or two away from losing it. Currently those on government funded health plans cannot access abortion care. While we are progressive in many areas, Colorado residents are still victims of systems that disproportionately marginalize women of color.

Coloradans for Protecting Reproductive Freedom, along with The Colorado Organization for Latina Opportunity and Reproductive Rights (COLOR), have launched a campaign to protect abortion from government interference. They are collecting signatures for a ballot measure that will help solidify abortion rights in our state, especially for those with limited access to resources. Andrea Arreola Soria is an organizing fellow with COLOR and a student here at MSU Denver. She says, "This ballot measure is a commitment to providing fair access to abortion care for those currently without it, like BIPOC, low-income, and young people to name a few." There are several hundred people across the state that are collecting signatures to get this on the ballot. I encourage everyone to reach out and learn more about this.




