Easter - 5th

- April is widely recognized as National Poetry Month, Stress Awareness Month, and Earth Month



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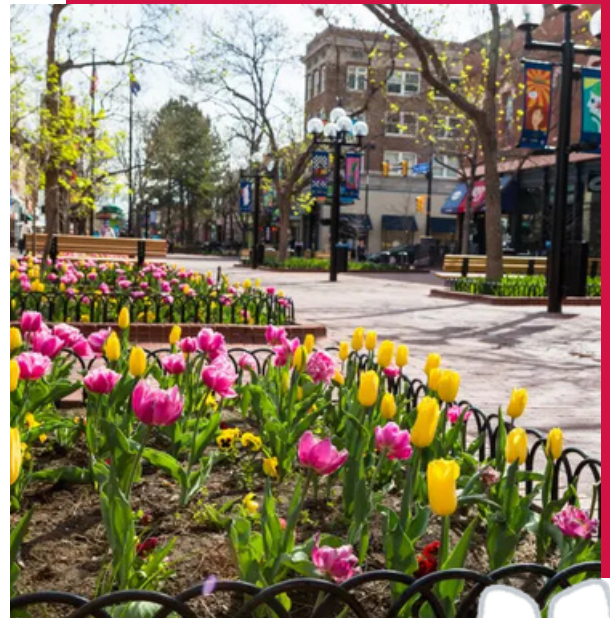


April - Almost there!
